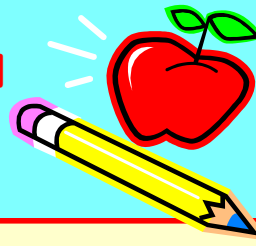

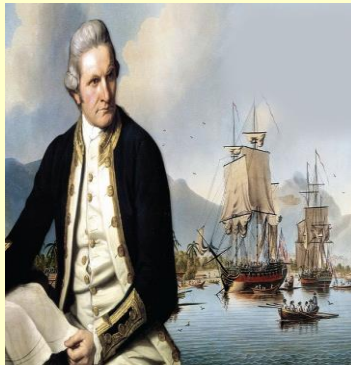

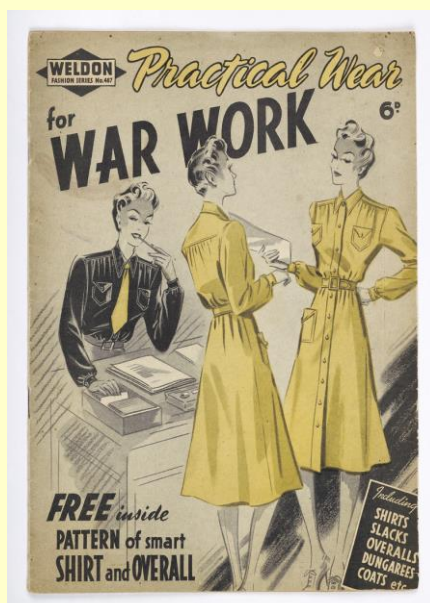
Dear Parents/Carers
