<u>Year 4</u>

Year 4 will have their multiplication assessment in June. Children do not need to get stressed about this. I find the best way to reduce stress is to feel in control. If the children log on to 'Times Tables Rockstars' for just 10-15 minutes a day Monday to Friday, they will feel in control and reap the benefits.

They also use Times Tables Rockstars in school each day.

Times Tables Rockstars can be accessed on phones, ipads, PCs and laptops. Log in details are in the reading records that come home each night.

<u>Year 1</u>

Year 1 will have their phonics (letter sounds) knowledge assessed in June. If you want to support your child in preparation for this you can hear them read each night and access RWInc Tutorial videos on You Tube. You can use the colour band on your child's book to access the correct level.

Nursery to Reception

Mrs Griffiths will be in touch with parents in the next few weeks to set a date for a transition meeting from Nursery to Reception. She will also organize dates for parents to come into school and have a lunch with their children, as part of the transition.
